I. INTRODUCTION

During 1973, the 242d Avn Co (SUGARBEARS) operated with a full complement of 22 CH-47A aircraft. In addition to normally assigned missions of troop support, the SUGARBEARS broadened their horizon with several firsts in mission support. One outstanding example was a night paradrop supporting C Company (Airborne) 4th Bn, 9th Inf (MANCHUS) conducted during October. With the skillful aid of the Pathfinders, four Chinooks released 88 Paratroopers into the darkness of the Northern sky marking the first paradrop by Chinooks at night in Alaska. On hand for and part of the drop was our Commanding General, General Sidney Marks. Highlighting 1973 for the SUGARBEARS was our attainment of 10,000 accident free flight hours in Alaska during September. We, as SUGARBEARS, were indeed proud to become the first unit within the command to accomplish this milestone and give credit to the neverending, professional attitude of each individual in the unit. The harsh environment in which we operate, test the unit's abilities daily. Announced during 1973 was the selection of Specialist Six Edward W Warmbler as USAF AL crew chief of the year for 1972. A veteran of Alaska, he is a shining example of the unit's professional attitude. In 1973, the SUGARBEARS flew four thousand sixty three hours, hauled two

III. MAJOR FIELD EXERCISES

A. ACE CARD VI

During the period 9 February thru 17 February, 18 SUGARBEAR aircraft supported elements of the 172d Arctic Light Infantry Brigade, 4th/9th Inf, 4th/23d Inf and 1st/37th Arty from a field location near the city of Nome, Alaska. This Joint Field Training Exercise tested the ability of the Arctic soldier to recapture a foothold location taken by the enemy to spearhead his drive in totally capturing Alaska. During the exercise, the SUGARBEARS flew two hundred ninety six hours, hauled seven hundred sixty six thousand fifty pounds of cargo, and transported one thousand one hundred thirty five passengers.

B. SUSATANA I

During the period 1 April thru 9 April, 14 SUGARBEAR aircraft supported 1st Bn 69th Inf from a field location near Anchorage, Alaska. In support of the operation, the SUGARBEARS flew two hundred ninety nine hours, hauled six hundred ninety six thousand pounds of cargo, and lifted one thousand two hundred eighty six passengers.

C. TOMAHAWK THRUST I

From 14 June thru 17 June, the SUGARBEARS supported elements of the 4th Bn 23d Infantry from the Brigade for a field exercise near Ft. Wainwright, Alaska. In support of the operation, the company

flew fifty one hours, hauled two hundred thirty three thousand five hundred pounds of cargo, and lifted six hundred eighty four passengers.

D. EMBER DAWN V

During the period 11 August thru 19 August, 16 SUGARBEAR aircraft supported the 4th/9th Inf, 4th/21st Inf, 1st/60th Inf and 1st/37th Arty on a Joint Field Training Exercise from Buffalo LZ near Fort Greely, Alaska. Having taken the complexes of Fairbanks-Fort Wainwright and Eielson the aggressor was threatening Ft. Greely and the town of Big Delta. The Infantry's Mission was to defend against the enemy until reinforcements could be flown into drive the enemy out of Alaska. In support of the operation the SUGARBEARS flew three hundred twenty nine hours, hauled five hundred forty five thousand eight hundred pounds of cargo and lifted four thousand three passengers.

IV. RESCUE OPERATIONS

During 1973, the SUGARBears participated in several rescue operations. Highlighting the year were two daring rescues from Mt. McKinley. On the 14th of July we were tasked to rescue sick and injured mountain climbers from the 15,000 ft level of Mt McKinley. The crews preplanning led to a successful rescue with no major problems. During August members of an Army climbing team assaulted the mountain. Having used up their oxygen supply early in the climb several members became sick and the SUGARBears once again saved the lives of their fellow comrades.

V. FOREST FIRE AND FIRE BUCKET MISSIONS

Fires in our area of responsibility proved somewhat during 1973. Several fire bucket missions were flown with excellent results. An agreement to support Air Force land near Fort Wainwright is in the negotiating process and should prove fruitful.

VI. VIP VISITS AND SUPPORT

The SUGARBears supported various Infantry and Artillery missions for General Abrams visit during November. The demonstration also included a display of an Arctic Maintenance Shelter mounted on the aft deck of a Chinook. The shelter proved to be a valuable asset for certain types of maintenance during extreme cold temperatures.

VII. SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

A. Unit accomplishments: During 1973 the SUGARBEARS sponsored a Easter happening for members of the Careage North Convalescent home. The wives provided Easter Baskets and a number of cakes for the occasion which brought great joy to the Senior citizens of Fairbanks. In softball, the unit took first place in the Fort Wainwright intramural league. The SUGARBEARS enjoyed an undefeated season and enjoyed the extra physical exercise. During December, we delivered numerous christmas presents to Nulato and Chalkistsic native children spreading Christmas joy to the far reaches of the North.

B. Ferry Flights: On 31 Oct 73, three CH-47's departed Ft. Wainwright for New Cumberland Army Depot. Numerous problems were encountered and support was slow when parts of maintenance personnel were needed. On 26 Nov 73, the aircraft arrived and the return trip began with three refitted Chinooks. As the year ended, the Ferry Aircraft were in St. Louis Missouri and the SUGARBEARS were hopeful they would receive the new aircraft.

C. From 1 March thru 14 March the SUGARBEARS supported elements of the Brigade on breaking trail for the Idedirod Sled Race. During the period we flew 53 hours, hauled 63,150 lbs of cargo and carried 164 passengers.

VIII. LESSONS LEARNED AND PROBLEM AREAS

One major accomplishment was the reduction of cold injuries to Infantry troops loading and unloading the aircraft. By starting the Auxiliary Power Unit and taking both engines to the ground idle position, the wind chill is greatly reduced and loading time is expedited. Many personnel were transported in temperatures below -30 degrees Fahrenheit and no cold injuries were reported. Fuel support for the CH-47 on long distance mission continues to be a problem. If missions are to be flown where fuel is not available, an excessive amount of load time is required to preposition fuel for the operation. The CH-47 has the extended range which is comparable with other helicopters in Alaska and would be a definite asset to the unit's mission.

242d soldier selected Crew Chief of the Year

Once a year the United States Army, Alaska selects one member from its ranks to be the Crew Chief of the Year. This year the honors went to Specialist Six Edward W. Warmbier, a crack flight engineer from the 242d Aviation Company.

SP6 Warmbier was selected for his qualities both as a flight engineer and a soldier. During the judging period SP6 Warmbier was unaware that he had been chosen to represent his unit. At the same time the officers and enlisted men who knew of his nomination were pulling for him in hopes that he would make the grade.

"The men of the 242d have the greatest respect and admiration for him," said Captain William L. Haines, Section Leader for the 242d Aviation Company. "He (SP6 Warmbier) works hard and diligently at his job." For SP6 Warmbier this meant long hours in sub-zero temperatures during the winter and participation in all the field problems for the past year.

Being selected as Crew Chief of the Year meant competition with mechanics who work on all other types of Army aircraft that operate in Alaska. A job as a crew chief is not an easy one. A maintenance check is performed before each flight to check for broken or missing parts and fuel leaks. If action is needed it is taken. SP6 Warmbier has signed for the Chinook that he works on. This makes his job a little more important and adds a little to the pride he has in the work he is doing.

When the final word came from USARAL SP6 Warmbier commented, "I had no idea that I was being considered for this honor. I enjoy working in aviation and for me it's a good field."

A simple award ceremony followed, with a silver plaque being presented by Lieutenant Colonel James H. Kitterman, commander 222d Aviation Battalion and Major Larue Rosengrant, commanding officer, 242d Aviation Company.
